



Orthopedic Surgeons Must be at the bedside within 30 minutes of request for the following:

1. Hemodynamically unstable, secondary to pelvic fracture
2. Suspected extremity compartment syndrome
3. Fractures/dislocations with risk of avascular necrosis (e.g., femoral head or talus)
4. Vascular compromise related to a fracture or dislocation
5. Trauma surgeon discretion

The attending orthopaedic surgeon must be involved in the clinical decision-making for care of these patients.
